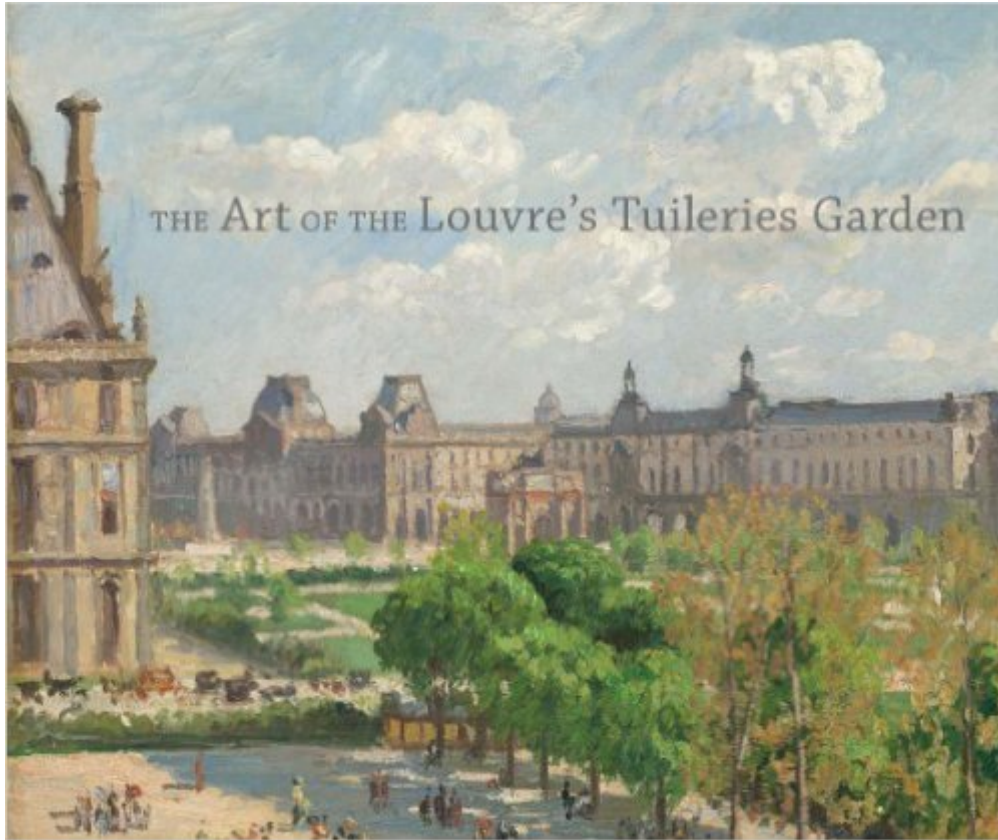

In The Art of the Louvre's Tuileries Garden at the High Museum catalogue you are able to transverse time and space and visit the garden whenever you want. The exhibit at the High Museum refers to the 63 acre garden that surrounds the Louvre Museum. Works there have inspired countless masters from Edward Monet,

Camille Pissarro, and photographers Eugène Atget and Henri Carier-Bresson to name a few. This show also celebrates the 400th birthday of André Le Nôtre who was commissioned by Louis XIV in 1664 to create the formal French garden known as the Tuileries. It has rich commentary and the color plates reproductions are full of rich details. I have enjoyed reaching over to this catalogue on a lack luster day and am transformed to the beauty of the Tuileries Garden. The exhibit moves from the High Museum in Atlanta to Toledo (Feb. 13- May 11, 2014), and finally cross country to Portland (June 14- Sept. 28, 2014).
