

As a strong believer in supporting the health of our planet, I am committed to help in the effort. That takes research, and a great place to start is with the writings of Frederick Law Olmsted. Central Park gave Olmsted his start, but there were many other projects. The National Association for Olmsted Parks has created a map showing the thousands of projects designed by the Olmsted family over a century-long span. By the early 1880s he had already designed Manhattanâ [™]s Riverside Park, Brooklynâ [™]s Prospect Park, Niagara Falls State Park, Chicagoâ [™]s South Park system, and Detroitâ [™]s Belle Isle. Other commissions included numerous college campuses such as Cornell University, University of Berkeleyâ [™]s Piedmont Avenue, and the University of Maine, the management of the Yosemite Valley and the Mariposa Big Tree Grove, and the grounds of the U.S. Capitol.Olmsted was devoted to trees all of his life.
